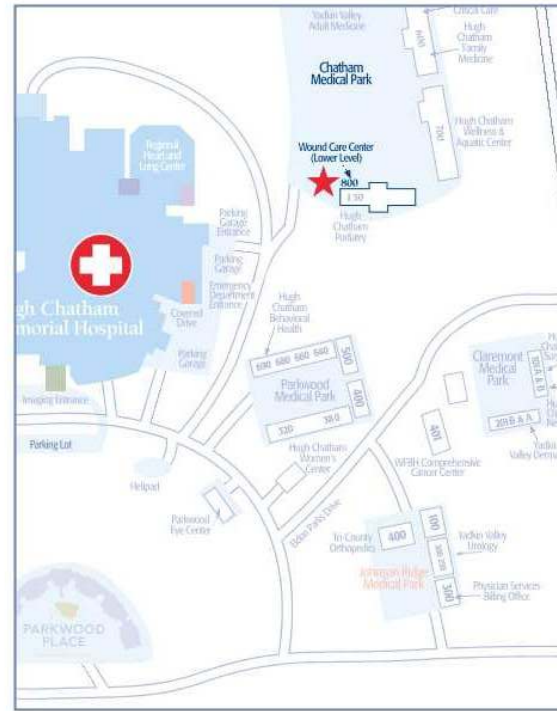

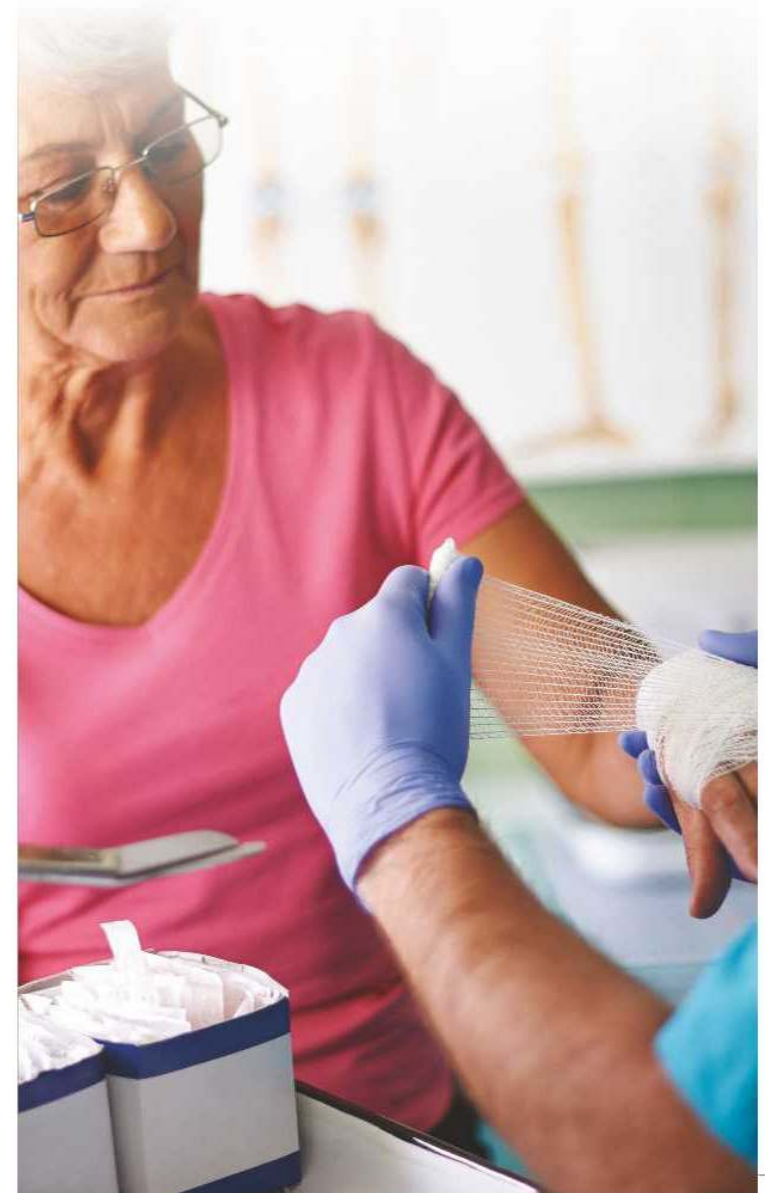

## What You Can Expect When You Call and Visit

### Prepare for Your First Visit

- Make an appointment** by calling 336-527-1033.
- Give us the name of your referring physician.** Your referring physician will continue to oversee your medical care. We'll give him or her regular updates on your wound treatments.
- Bring your list of allergies, medications,** herbal supplements and other over-the-counter products you are taking.
- Bring past medical records, insurance cards and forms** for your first visit.
- Remember that Hugh Chatham Regional Wound Center accepts **Medicare, Medicaid and most insurance plans.**
- Your first visit will take about an hour.** If you are diabetic, please bring a snack and any medications you may need to take during your visit.

## Together, We'll Develop Your Plan of Care

Our clinical team of physicians, nurses and other specialists will work closely with you to:

- Review your medical history, blood work and specialized tests
- Complete your physical assessment
- Assess, measure and document your wound
- Document additional information needed to formulate your individual plan of care
- Develop an individualized treatment plan for your wound
